> standard is reflected in how we instruct, how we teach, and what we teach.



#### Who do you say we are?

It's that time of year again! The Kumquat Festival is January  $25^{\rm th}-$  the last



Saturday of January. We must begin making our kumquat pies. This is a huge task, but with many hands it is manageable. There is NO experience necessary — just a willingness to work. So watch for the sign-up sheet. If you are not able to help make pies, perhaps you could offer to cut and



serve them at the Kumquat Festival. We need a lot of help to cut, serve, and sell pies as fast as we can that day! We hope this year to make 750 pies. Cutting the frozen pies requires a little muscle, so we appreciate help from our fathers in this particular task.

We are taking advanced orders for pies. In the past, we have sold every last pie by mid-afternoon, so if you want to ensure that you get a pie, the pre-order form may be the option for you. Sr. Donna has sold about 50 so far! Thank you, Sr. Donna! This is a major fundraiser for our center and very important.

The second best fundraiser is our Baskets. We ask everyone to make themebased baskets and then raffle them on February 2<sup>nd</sup>, the first Sunday in February. We normally have between 60 and 80 baskets to raffle. Examples of baskets we've received in the past are: a Valentine basket, pet supply basket, car wash basket, hair and beauty basket, baking basket, gift card basket, and more — the possibilities of themed baskets are limited only by your imagination! Some baskets come complete and already put together, while some require assembly. We always need help putting the latter baskets together. In the past, we had a king-size, homemade quilt! It would be nice to have a similar big ticket item in place of the quilt this year. We'll be sending home information about the baskets fundraiser soon.

Our children, your children, the future of our church and community thank you for your continued generosity and involvement!
