

We are using the funds from the greenery sales to purchase two new curriculums. The first is Sadlier "Discovering God's Child" Religious Curriculum for the Pre-School classes. This will replace the annual "Seeds Weekly Gospels" that we have used for several years. The teachers are very

excited to receive this reusable resource for their classrooms. The second is the new updated version of "The Creative Curriculum". Our Center has used "The Creative Curriculum" for many years and found that it is excellent in encompassing the whole child in learning. The Florida Office of Early Learning requires the 5st addition of "The Creative Curriculum" for 4 and 5 year olds (VPK). This newest version continues the correlation with the Florida Sunshine Standards for Infants, and Toddlers all the way through to Preschool and Four Year old VOK Standards. We are sure that these updated Curriculums will enhance your child's daily learning experiences.

During October and November our staff will begin the Diocesan Catechist Certification Training. The Modules will be offered here for anyone that would like to receive this training. October 1, 2014 is the Orientation and Module II will begin October & and run through November 12, 2014. The cost for Orientation is \$18.00 and the cost for Module II is \$ 20.00.
