## **VPK**

Welcome November! We are ready for the cooler weather and looking forward to opening our classroom windows. Please remember when our weather becomes cooler, layers work best. Mornings might be cool, but it still gets warm in the afternoons. Also, please label all sweaters and jackets. I always seem to have a few extra at the end of the year.

We will continue with our Fall unit using the study topics, <u>Leaves and Harvest</u>. Stories, songs and learning activities such as matching upper and lower case letters on fall leaves, exploring different kinds of gourds, mixing different colors at the easel and lacing leaves (to help us practice left-right progression) will round out our unit. We will match many different kinds of counters with numbers, practice our ordinal numbers when we line up and take a nature walk to count different objects.

Next, we will begin a unit on **Thanksgiving.** Our Families will be the focus for this study. We'll create a "family wall" with a family page. Each child will need a family picture and some basic information. I will send home a form to be filled out and returned. Watch for more information. To help celebrate Thanksgiving we will also be discussing "what we are thankful for": our families, friends, homes, and school. We'll make turkey tracks from left to right, create a Thanksgiving placemat, read many stories and learn some Thanksgiving songs. Our annual Thanksgiving celebration will be on Friday, November 20th. Watch for more information.

Our Bright Beginnings will offer us lessons from 1 Kings 17 and 2 Kings: 4&5. Our bible concept is: I can Pray to God and Thank Him for His Goodness. We will also begin discussing Advent, a time of waiting for the birth of Jesus. Each week we will light candles on our Advent wreath. The light will grow brighter as we approach the Nativity.


