





## Peek at Our Week

<p>Demonstrates knowledge related to living things and their environments</p>	<p>Ocean Bingo When playing, each child will have their own card. Instead of calling the animal/creature by their name, clues about the animal will be said. Ex. "find me the animal that is black and white and has a blowhole to help them breathe" they would then place their clear gemstone on the orca whale.</p>	<p>Go on a walk with your child and play a game of "I Spy". Describe a specific object or animal you may see on your walk and ask your child to help you identify what object you may be talking about.</p>
<p>Uses imagination and creativity to express self with intention using a variety of open-ended, process-oriented, and diverse art materials</p>	 <p>Paper Plate Whale</p>	<p>Using paper plates to create art has many uses! Gather some glue, scissors, paper plates, paint/markers, and other various art materials. Let your imagination flow in creating art with your child. You may use the paper plates to create other ocean animals or even a boat!</p>
<p>Counts and identifies the number sequence "1 to 10"</p>	<p>Ocean roll and graph game</p> 	<p>I have attached a copy of the game as well as the cut out for the dice. Take turns rolling the dice, whichever animal appears on the dice, place a small item, pennies, beans, popcorn kernels, etc. to help keep score on which animal has been rolled the most.</p>
