### ***Notes from Cindie...***

#### **Communication is not just for adults.**

Let me tell you about this picture. One of the children was playing alone building a fort out of sticks, leaves, rocks and sand. A second child knocked down the fort. I used the moment to teach appropriate social skills about making mistakes and making amends. I discussed with the two children about how each of them were feeling when the fort was knocked down. The first child said he was sad that the fort was broken. The second child said he was excited when he saw the fort and wanted to play with the first child.

We discussed *and* role played how to “ask to play” and how to invite a friend to play with us.

It is important as adults to realize that sometimes children do things when they are experiencing strong emotions that may look like a different behavior. The second child wanted to play with the first but could not at that moment ask appropriately. When talking to your children about behavior it is vital that we teach the “way” to behave. It is more than just saying “be good today”. We must, as adults, teach the children what that “looks” like. Role play with your children *how* to ask to play, *how* to ask to borrow something. We must give them the words at first. Children do not inherently know what to say to one another they must be taught what to say. We say to children, “ Say Please”, “Say Thank you”, “Say You’re Welcome” WE should also teach them to say, “ May I play with you”, “Would you like to play with me?”

It is also important to teach them how to accept when someone tells them “no”. A child may ask to play with a toy and is refused by the other child. Then what? Teach them to accept that they may have to wait a turn and to ask the other child to let them have the toy when they are finished, and teach your child to know how to say, “May I have it when you are finished?” and “I will give it to you when I am finished”, if they are asked by another child to play with something they are playing with .

The story of the picture goes on... after the two children began to rebuild the fort, a third child arrived to join in. The first child that had been building the fort looked at the arriving children and said “do you want to build a fort with us?” The arriving child agreed and they began to build, adding sticks, small pebbles, and leaves to the structure. Then a fourth child ran up and shouted, “I want to play”! The first three children quickly scrambled to cover the fort with their bodies so it would not get knocked over again. They all shouted “NO!, Don’t knock it over!” The child that had arrived stopped and yelled, “but, I want to play here too!” the second child that had originally knocked over the fort stood up and said to the new child, “ You have to ask nicely, that is how you ask to play!” The fourth child looked at the group, waited a few moments and said , “can I play?” and the other three children said, “Yes” and began telling the child what they were doing to complete the fort.

A bit later, a fifth child walked up to the group and watched quietly. Again, the second child that had knocked down the fort noticed the child. After a few moments he got up and went to the child that was watching and said , “do you want to play with us?” the fifth child nodded yes and joined in the play. The first child began

explaining to the last child what they were doing and where they were getting the building items from and their play continued for another 15 minutes before they announced as a group to me that it was complete and I should come and take a picture of the fort.

It is not always the case that a redirection and role play exercise turns out as amazing as this day did. Sometimes it does not seem to matter at all what we have said. However, the children *ARE* listening to what we say and watching what we do everyday. We have been role playing these situations and talking with the children about what they can say since the first day of school. It is important to keep practicing these skills with children everyday.

Repetition and practice are important for baseball, piano, math skills, reading, spelling and anything else we want our children to be successful at. Communication takes just as much practice and repetition to create good social skills and the ability to communicate effectively with other children and adults. When children are able to communicate their needs and ideas they are more successful in social situations are able to build strong friendships and are more successful academically in school and later on as an adult.

Verbal skills beginning with the infants is paramount for deeper learning and understanding. Read to your children everyday, including newspapers, magazines, chapter books, science and math books. All are great things to read with your children. The greater the variety the more connections your child will make in understanding the world around them.

Communication requires two sides. Speaking and Listening. Talk with your children, not at them. Ask your children questions that require them to think of an answer, not just a yes or a no. Wait for them to formulate an answer and then listen as they explain their thoughts. Instilling good communication with your toddler and preschool children will lead to long-term, deeper conversations with your elementary age and high school student later on.
