

HOLIDAY BILLING

Now that it is fall and we are approaching the holidays, I wanted to take a few moments to cover tuition during the holidays. This often is a time of confusion.

As stated in your parent handbook and tuition agreement, "full tuition payments are due throughout the year, regardless of absences including, but not limited to, vacation, illness, holidays, or weather closings." This policy applies to all students other than those that are drop-in. This means that you will be billed your regular amount, at a minimum, during the holidays and school breaks whether or not you attend.

Those part-timers that only attend a few days each week, if appropriate, may opt to switch days during the same week with notice after teachers have verified availability. For students that typically attend partial days such as School Age and VPK wrappers but require care for full days during the holidays/school breaks, you may be billed more than your regular amount depending on how many full days are attended during these weeks.

If you have any questions about how your billing will be handled, please feel free to contact the office and we can give you an idea of what to expect. We will do our best to answer any questions you have about this process.

This month's self-help focus will be Asking for Help instead of crying. We will guide the children through walking away from a situation and asking for help. We will help the children to learn to use words to express their feelings and needs. Feelings such as frustration, anger and disappointment will be introduced along with strategies to handle with these feeling such as taking a deep breath and

counting to four or interacting with the sensory bottles or bins. If possible, please support your child through this learning process at home.

The children have really made excellent progress on their toileting skills. Most can go the bathroom all by themselves! Please remember to dress your child in elastic waist clothing which makes it easy for them to pull their pants up and down. Check your child's bin to see if they have extra clothes and that they are the correct size and seasonally appropriate.

As we finish up focusing on pumpkins, we will begin working on our farm unit. While working on our farm unit, the children will learn what vegetables grow on big farms and what food can grow in a garden at their home. We will also continue working with the 5-character kids to

help with the development of each child's social skills.

Each week, we will focus on a different subject that has to do with farming.

- The first week is the animals that you can find on a farm
- Second week is the food that can be grown
- Third week is learning how to plant the food that can be grown
- Fourth week is learning about the different kinds of equipment that you can find on a farm

VPK with Wrap

Welcome November! Welcome the cooler weather! Please remember that when our weather becomes cooler layers work best. The mornings may be cool, but it still gets warm in the afternoons. Please remember to put your child's name on their jackets to avoid a jacket going home with a different preschooler.

We will continue with our fall unit using the study topics of Gourds, Pumpkins, and Family/Thanksgiving. Our stories, songs, and learning activities will match up to what we are learning. We are focusing on the letters (upper and lower case). The letter sounds, and we frequently write in our journals. We will be exploring different kinds of pumpkins and gourds. Mixing different colors at the easel and lacing leaves. (This helps us practice left-right progression) this will round out our unit.

We will be learning a little more in math in many ways. We will be matching different kinds of counters with numbers, practicing our ordinal numbers, when we line up for our nature walk and we will count different objects. For Science, we will be weighing the different pumpkins and gourds. We will observe them, and we will be touching and tasting their interior for a sensory experience.

The Early Childhood Education domains that we are focusing on is the Cognition. This is the general knowledge of early mathematics and early scientific developments. For Family and Thanksgiving, and our Social Studies aspect, we

will be learning about Thanksgiving. The V.P.K will go into detail about the original American story. We will be discussing about the Native Americans. Where is Plymouth Rock? How the Pilgrims came to America? What is the Mayflower? How the Native Americans and Pilgrims became friends?

The V.P.K. will be cooking with Sister Donna. Sister Donna is a blessing to our V.P.K and She always comes up with the most creative food experiences for the children. Sister Donna also, teaches bible on Tuesdays and the children enjoy her in the church. If you are able and would like to donate pumpkins and gourds to our class, it would be appreciated. Your



donations go a long way and do not go unnoticed. Our children cook, explore, and create. Thank you. We will be having a Thanksgiving Luncheon on November 22 at 11:45 am. October was a very fun, exciting, and tangible learning month for our children. We would like to thank you dear parents/grandparents who donated Baskets, who came to assemble Baskets for our Basket Raffle to raise fund for our School, who bring ingredients for our monthly cooking experiences and who bring our monthly snack donation.

Our Study Topics for this month include: *All Saints Day, All Souls Day, Fall Leaves, Harvest, All about Family and Thanksgiving.*

November 1 is a special day called the *feast of All Saints*. It is the day the Church celebrates with all the people who have died and are now with God in heaven. We will discuss about Saint Mother Theresa of Calcutta (whom I know personally) who loved

Jesus so much and shared His love with others. She used to say" Do small things for others with great love for Jesus". We will be learning to do small things for others with great love for Jesus.

All Souls' Day is on November 2 and is dedicated to those who have died and not yet reached heaven. We remember all of our departed dear ones and pray for them. You are most welcome to bring a picture of any of your departed dear ones to our class.

We will be discussing Fall *Leaves* and their color changes from green to red, orange, yellow and brown. We will learn what happens to them when they fall of the tree? We read Stories, sing songs, we count leaves, decorate leaves, and sought out the leaves by color and size.

We will be talking about our *Family and Thanksgiving*. We will discuss who is in our families and how do we celebrate Thanksgiving with our family members. We will be reading many stories about Thanksgiving and other learning activities such as Thanksgiving songs, art, patterning, and we will discuss about what we are thankful for, such as our family members, friends, school etc.

We will be learning making pattern and continue our study of the Math activities for building number sense to 1-20, Learning Alphabet letter, sound and we brainstorm to find the words that begin with that letter. And we started to learn sight words and compound words.

This month we are focusing on the *Social and Emotional Developmental domain*. We learn to take turns, help our friends, play together, sharing and cooperate with others. We learn to recognize and understand our own feelings and actions and those of other people, and how our own feelings and actions affect ourselves and others. And we learn to express thoughts, feelings, and behaviors in socially appropriate ways and to calm down when we are angry or excited.

Please continue to help us what we need for our monthly cooking experiences and with our monthly snack donation. We greatly appreciate all you do, to support our classroom and may God bless and reward you for your thoughtfulness and generosity.
