Coordinates the use of hands and fingers</p>	<p>Children will be able to use sensory activities where they will use their hands. Such as:</p> <p>Playdough (They will cut it, roll it, grab, and squeeze it.)</p> <p>Play kitchen (They will stack cups, food, and practice to pretend to use utensils.)</p>	<p>Cut an orange in half and show children how to squeeze juice from the fruit and then enjoy drinking the juice from a cup.</p> <p>Have child place coins into a piggy bank.</p>

Develops positive relationships with adults</p>	<p>Provide opportunities for children to talk about their weekends and open up about their family and lives.</p> <p>Ask open ended questions regarding the childrens family</p>	<p>Talk with children in the classroom when they pick up their child at the end of the day.</p> <p>Encourage children to talk about adults visiting in their classroom.</p>
