


The children will then identify if they are a primary or secondary color, and then the children given primary colors will go on to find their partner that they can color mix with and together they will figure out who their secondary color partner is	Play a similar game with your child and the rest of the family at home using found objects from around the house.

Get out some paint and spend time with your child mixing different colors, tints and shades of each color, then talk about and paint with your child their favorite landmarks they have learned about so far.
