Recognizes and names typical shapes (circle, square, triangle)</p> 	<p>Shape hunt- At circle this week, we will have magnifying glasses made into different shapes (circle, rectangle, square, triangle). introduce them to the children and talk about the different shapes. select the circle (this week are working on the circle) magnifying glass and choose one of the children to walk around the room with a teacher and use their magnifying glass to identify items that are shaped like circles in the room. Each child will have a turn,</p>	<p>Take your child on a shape hunt, walk around the house with them and see how many items you can find that are shaped like a circle.</p>
